



Your Child's First Day.



- School begins at 8.4-Oam please arrive <u>on time</u>.
- Parents to drop children outside school hall door
- Door closes at **8.50am**. If you arrive after the door is closed please take your child to the main reception, where they will be signed in.
- School finishes at **3:15pm**
- Children not collected by **3.25pm** teachers to inform school office to contact authorised adult



Please remember to:

- Encourage your child to become more independent.
- Keep PE kits in school and take home each half term.
- Check book bags every day for letters.



- Bring reading books in and sign them every day-Reading books are changed every Friday.
- Always bring a coat for going outside.
- Ensure ALL items of clothing are labelled with your child's name.
- Ensure tasks and reply slips are returned on time.

Packed lunches

If you provide your child with a packed lunch, they should support our school's healthy eating policy. Also note that <u>NO NUTS</u> and <u>FIZZY DRINKS</u> are allowed in school lunches.

School Dinners

- Your child is entitled to a free school meal.
- We offer a cold buffet selection or hot meal daily from the servery. The children are told in a morning what their options are and then a dinner register is taken by the class teacher.

<u>Snacks</u>

Your child will receive a piece of fruit everyday

<u>Drinks</u>

- Water is available throughout the day, including lunchtimes.
- Children will bring a water bottle (labelled) to school which is kept in the classroom for children to access independently.
- Fruit juices and squash Lunchtimes ONLY





Reading

- Reading is an important skill and we value it highly.
- Please make sure children bring their book bags into school each day.
- You can help support your child's reading development by listening to them read, reading to them yourself and sharing a variety of books at home.
- We value your support and encourage you to contribute to your child's reading diary, regularly.
- Look out for a 'Reading' work shop in the first term.

- Talk with your child, ask questions about their learning








CLASS DOJOS- Rewards
