## Our Daily Routines in Year 3







- Children to be dropped off at classroom doors.
- Doors close at 8.50am. If you arrive after the door is closed, please take your child to the main reception, where they will be signed in.
- Morning playtime will be at 10:45 11:00am
- Lunchtime will be at 12:15 1:15pm
- School finishes at 3:15pm children are dismissed from the classroom doors.





## Our Daily Routines in Year 3



- Children should bring their reading books and diaries daily into school.
- PE will take place **twice weekly** we will let you know at the start of Autumn term Year 3's PE days.

(PE kits to brought in at start of term, and taken home at end of half term to be washed!)



### School Meals



- Please note that the Universal Free Meals programme applies only to children in Reception to Year 2.
- For Year 3, school meals will be chargeable at the cost of £2.40 per day (£12.00 weekly). If your child is entitled to the Flexible Charging meals scheme, the cost will be £1.40 per day (£7.00 weekly). If you think your child might be entitled to Free School Meals, please contact the school office to discuss completion of the relevant form.
- Dinner money should be paid on a weekly or half termly basis through the Arbor payment system



## What are the changes to the curriculum in Year 3?

There is an increased focus on spelling

In English, your child will continue to work on the spelling patterns they have begun in previous years, but this year there is less of a focus on phonics and more emphasis on understanding and learning the spelling rules, as well as attention to prefixes and suffixes

In Year 3, times tables remain very important to help children as they work towards their Y4 Times table test. We ask that you practise them together please over the Summer to best prepare your child (2x 5x 10x and also the 3x and 4x if possible).

In Key Stage 2, French is taught each week as part of our Modern Foreign Languages.



## Building your child's independence



• Encourage your child to become as independent as they can be (for example, tying shoelaces and ties)

- This is not just jumpers, but shirts, lunchboxes, coats anything
  you would like returning needs a name!
- We try to encourage children to be responsible for their own belongings and find their own things!

Please could we also ask that you....

- Check book bags every day for letters.
- Bring reading books in and sign them each day Reading books are changed weekly.
- Make sure that your child is always prepared for the weather
- Ensure tasks and reply slips are returned on time.
- Make sure that your child does not bring valuables into school (jewellery toys)














## School Uniform.

# We promote healthy eating!

#### Packed lunches

If you provide your child with a packed lunch, we ask that you support our school's healthy eating policy Also note that <u>NO NUTS</u> and <u>FIZZY DRINKS</u> are allowed in school lunches.



#### School Dinners

If your child will be eating a school meal, we offer a cold buffet selection or hot meal daily from the servery. The children are told in a morning what their options are and then a dinner register is taken by the class teacher:

#### Snacks

Your child will receive a piece of fruit and a bagel every day

#### Drinks

Water is available throughout the day including lunchtimes.

Children will need to bring a labelled water bottle to school which is kept in the classroom for children to access independently

Fruit juices and squash are for lunchtimes ONLY
